COVID 19 TESTING GUIDELINES

The main symptoms of Coronavirus are:

- high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- **a new, continuous cough** this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE SYMPTOMATIC MUST:

- Isolate immediately and take a test
- If positive must self isolate for 10 days

HOUSEHOLDS MUST :

• Isolate for 14 days

THE SCHOOL MUST:

- Contact your local health protection team (HPT) on <u>0300 303 8537 option 1</u> who will
 - Contact you directly if they are aware that someone who has tested positive has attended the school
 - Carry out a rapid risk assessment to confirm who has been in close contact with the person and ensure they are asked to self isolate
 - Work with the school to guide you through the actions you need to take
- Schools must send home people who have been in close contact with an infected individual, and they must self isolate for 14 days since LAST contact with that person
 - <u>Close contact means</u>
 - Direct close contact face to face contact with the infected individual for any length of time, within 1 metre, including being coughed on, a face-to-face conversation, or unprotected physical contact (skin-to-skin)
 - 2. Proximity contact extended close contact (within 1 to 2 for more than 15 mins) with an infected individual.
 - 3. Travelling in a small vehicle, like a car, with an infected person

The local HPT will advise on who must be sent home

- Individuals can end their isolation if there are NO symptoms AND a negative test result
- If further symptoms develop there will be a need to isolate and a further test may be appropriate

- After the full isolation period they can return to school as long as there is no temperature there may still be a cough present.
- Another test is not required as they may still have some virus in their body but are no longer contagious

SCHOOL TESTING KITS

- The test kits sent to schools are ONLY to be offered in EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES to individuals (pupils, teachers and staff) who:
- Have developed symptoms while at school AND
- You believe they may have barriers to accessing a test elsewhere
- You believe if you sent the individual home without a kit they would not receive a test at all

Schools should NOT be conducting coronavirus testing on site, unless in the case of a boarder

Individuals should NOT attend school to receive a test if they have developed symptoms outside of school

Advise parents to ring 111 if at any point symptoms get worse

STEP BY STEP GUIDANCE TO GIVE TO PARENTS – all to be done on the same day

- 1. Read instructions inside test pack
- 2. Conduct testing at home
- 3. Register test kits online to ensure they receive a result
- 4. Return test kit via Royal Mail Priority box
