English: Both sets will concentrate in preparation for CE and scholarship, developing confidence to tackle unseen poetry and prose comprehension, as well as writing for a variety of purposes. Mr Whitworth will explore pre-twentieth century literature, while Miss Williamson will focus on nature and the environment. French: This term, our preparation for CE and Scholarship will focus on refining pupils' use of the three main tenses, as well as the conditional and imperfect for Scholarship candidates. Pupils will also be preparing for their first practice oral examination. In addition to this, we will also be covering the topic of House, Home and Chores. Geography: The Year 8's kicked off their return to school with their CE fieldwork enquiry. This required the children to collect, measure and record primary data outside of the classroom at different points along the River Glaven. The first part of the term will involve the enquiry write up which links together the theme of rivers and coasts.	R.S. (TPR) : With <i>Great Thinkers and their Ideas</i> complete, the children will apply philosophical thinking and focus on the study of ethics and contemporary moral issues, specifically: just war, punishment, life and death and the environment, within a Christian context.
